

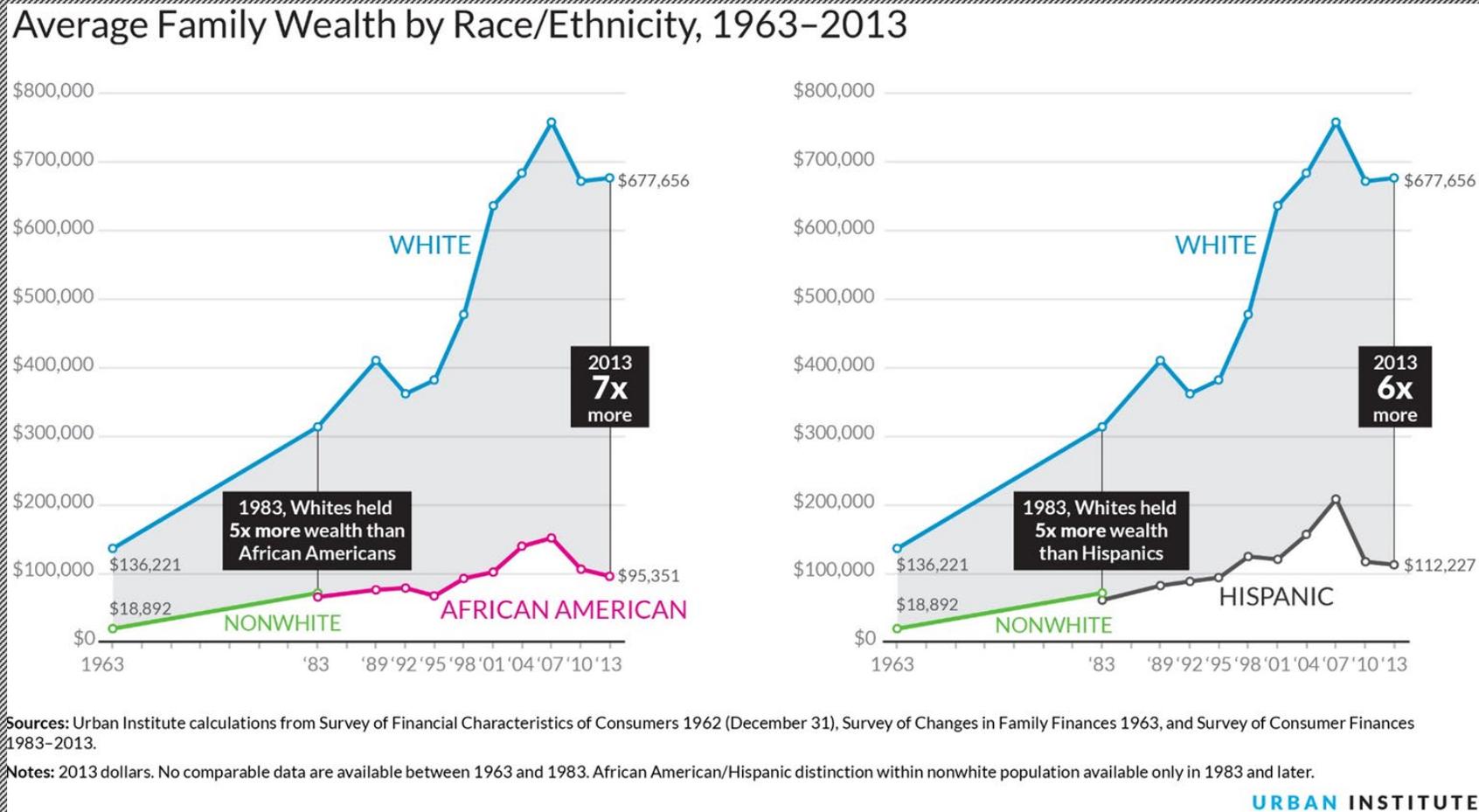

Race and Class are a Combined Problem



Race Locks in Class Inequality

- Group identity undergirds justification for inequality.
- Race, Ethnicity, Tribe, etc. provide a political reason to ignore inequality
- Heterogeneous societies have less economic disparity

Guilt Free Explanations Abound

Social Dominance Theory and Racial Hierarchy

Group stratification and dominance is a universal trait across human societies although the intensity and the grounds vary across societies and across time within societies.*

Social Dominance

Human societies tend to organize as group-based social hierarchies in which at least one group enjoys greater social status and power than other groups.

Benefits of Dominance: Disparate share of positive social value

- Political power
- Wealth
- Security
- Abundant quality food
- Quality housing
- Health Care/Medical Services
- Education
- Leisure

Costs of Subordination: Disparate share of negative social value

- Substandard housing
- Disease
- Unemployment/Underemployment
- Dangerous and distasteful work
- Stigmatization
- Punishment
- Vilification

Hierarchy-Enhancing Legitimizing Myths / Ideologies

- Societal myths or ideologies that support existing social hierarchy(ies) based on moral or intellectual justifications

Hierarchy-Enhancing Legitimizing Myths / Ideologies

- Meritorious Karma
- The Divine Right of Kings
- Manifest Destiny
- Culture of Poverty
- The “Natural Order”
- Male Superiority/Female Inferiority
- White Superiority / Black, Latino, Asian, and Indian Inferiority

Hierarchy Enhancing Ideologies

- Black Criminality (pathological)
 - Young Black Super-predators
 - Latino Criminality (pathological)
- White Criminality (circumstantial/mental health based)

Hierarchy-Attenuating Myths/Ideologies

- Societal myths/ideologies that undermine social hierarchy

Hierarchy-Attenuating Myths/Ideologies

- Human rights,
- Equality before God
- Socialism
- Feminism
- Racial Pride
- LGBT Pride

Hierarchy Enhancing Institutions

- Reproduce and maintain social hierarchy through their allocation of more positive social value to dominant groups.
- Financial firms (e.g., Wall Street), corporations, police forces, criminal justice systems, and prisons all represent hierarchy enhancing institutions.

Hierarchy Attenuating Institutions

- These institutions provide disproportionate assistance to members of subordinate groups.
- Religious organizations aiding the poor, civil and human rights organizations, and welfare organizations are considered hierarchy attenuating institutions.

Social Dominance Psychology - SDO

- Social Dominance functions structurally and individually
- Societies include individuals who like/prefer group dominance (high SDO)
- SDO is predictable based on group membership, education and other factors

SDO and Juries

- In a rape trial study, SDO was positively associated with perceptions of African American defendant guilt, while SDO was negatively associated with perception of white defendant guilt.

SDO and Sentencing

- SDO was also positively correlated with sentence severity for African American defendants, while for white defendants SDO was negatively correlated with sentence severity.

SDO and Criminal Justice Policy

- Studies show that SDO influences support for criminal justice policies.
- High SDO correlates to belief in the fairness of the criminal justice system and its lack of racial bias.
- This belief, in turn, correlates to support for the death penalty and a lack of support for legal aid to indigent prisoners.

Social Dominance Psychology - SDO

- Members of subordinate groups typically have lower SDO
- So, Women, African Americans, Latinos, LGBT persons have lower SDOs
- However, education lowers SDO so people with more education typically have lower SDOs than those without education.

Hierarchy Enhancing Institutions and SDO*

- Hierarchy Enhancing Institutions are disproportionately run and staffed by people with high SDOs
- Hierarchy Attenuating Institutions are disproportionately run and staffed by people with lower SDOs
- Consider how prosecutor offices have fewer women and public defender offices have more women.

Historic Social Dominance via Racial Hierarchy in the USA

- Conquest (Native tribes)
- Slavery (Blacks)
- Land acquisition (Latinos)
- Immigration policy (Asians and others)
- Homeland security / counterterrorism (Arabs/Persians/Muslims)

Social Dominance and Terror

- Terrorism has been defined as the practice of using violence or intimidating methods to achieve political ends.
- When used by the state terror is typically used to maintain group dominance over subordinates.
