

**Dispositional Order Protection or Services Chapter 48**

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**Goal for CASE# 09-JC-123**

**BASED UPON THE RECORDS, FILES, AND PROCEEDINGS IN THIS CASE, THE COURT ORDERS:**

**CONDITIONS OF RETURN/SUPERVISION: THE PARENT(S)/GUARDIAN(S) MUST DEMONSTRATE THE BEHAVIORAL, COGNITIVE AND EMOTIONAL CAPACITY TO CARE FOR THEIR CHILD(REN) SAFELY BY COMPLETING THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:**

**Condition 1: Meet the following Goals for Behavioral Change.**

**Goal 1:** (Antoinette Fuller:)

Ms. Fuller demonstrates that she can effectively and safely parent her child and appropriately respond to the child's needs by maintaining sobriety in the community and refraining from using illegal drugs, non-prescribed medications, and alcohol to excess.

Services to target behavior change:

- AODA Assessment
- AODA treatment as recommended
- Random Urine Analysis
- Anger Management
- Domestic Violence therapy
- Psychological evaluation and follow recommendations.

The parent is also required by the Court to:

Ms. Fuller provides her own transportation either by driving herself, using the bus, or getting rides from friends to all appointments.

**Goal 2:** (Antoinette Fuller:)

Ms. Fuller demonstrates that she can ensure for the safety of her child and adequately meet their physical, emotional and mental health needs on a daily basis which would include scheduling and attending all medical, dental and any other appointments that are relevant for the health, development and well-being of the child, including using appropriate and effective discipline techniques and providing appropriate structure.

Services to target behavior change:

- Supervised visitation
- Parenting Assistance

**Goal 3:** (Antoinette Fuller )

Ms. Fuller obtains suitable housing for her child. This includes the ability to provide a residence that meets safety standards, food utilities, and ongoing needs of the child.

Services to target behavior change:

- Parenting Assistance to help Ms. Fuller find and maintain appropriate housing
- Assistance with obtaining full-time employment or further education.

**Goal 4:** (Tony Jones):

Mr. Jones demonstrate that he can effectively and safely parent his child and appropriately respond to his child's needs by maintaining sobriety in the community and refraining from engaging in criminal activity.

Services to target behavior change:

- AODA Assessment and AODA Treatment
- Random Urine Analysis.
- Parenting Assistance
- Anger Management
- Psychological evaluation and follow through on requirements

Mr. Jones provides his own transportation either by driving himself, using the bus, or getting rides with friends.

**Goal 5** (Tony Jones):

Mr. Jones demonstrates that he is able to meet his own emotional needs and maintains consistent emotional stability by consistently participating in treatment that address his emotional and mental health needs. This would include: regular attendance at psychiatric appointments, medical compliance, regular attendance at outpatient therapy, and consistent implementation of mental health providers' recommendations.

Services to target behavior change:

- Mental health treatment
- Outpatient therapy
- Medication Management if appropriate.

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**Condition 2: All parents must maintain a relationship with your child/ren by regularly participating in successful visitation with the child/ren unless the parent's visits are limited by the court.**

**Services to be provided by DHS for visitation:**

DHS shall set up and follow a reasonable visitation plan, including sibling visitation if the siblings are subject to court orders and not placed in the same home. DHS shall conduct ongoing assessments of the family's visitation plan, which shall include consultation with therapists and visitation workers working with the family. If the Permanency Plan for the family is Reunification, family interactions should be maximized, consistent with the safety of the children. Visits should be in home and unsupervised unless safety concerns require supervision.

**Special orders on Visitation:**

- Visitation between the parent(s), \_\_\_\_\_, and the child \_\_\_\_\_ shall be based upon mutual desire for visits.
- Before having visitation with the following child(ren), \_\_\_\_\_ the parent(s) \_\_\_\_\_ must meet the following pre-conditions:
- Other Special Conditions on Visitation:

*Visitation between mother and the child shall be supervised by DHS or its designee until a time when the GAL deems that it is appropriate to transition to unsupervised contact. Visitation shall begin to be held at a supervised visitation center until such time that DHS and the assigned GAL agree it can occur elsewhere. If at any time the supervised visitation worker believes that the parent is under the influence of drugs or alcohol, the visit will terminate immediately.*

**Condition 3: All parents must demonstrate an ability and willingness to provide a safe level of care for the child. A safe level of care is described as follows:**

1. The parent demonstrates the ability to have a safe, suitable and stable home.
2. The parent does not abuse the child(ren) or subject them to the risk of abuse. **Note:** Your child(ren) are being abused if he/she is hit with cords, belts, sticks or other objects; has/have bruises, cuts, burns, or marks of any kind caused by another person; are having sexual contact with anyone or see sexual activity.
3. The parent demonstrates they are able and willing to care for the child(ren) and their special needs on a full-time basis.
4. The parent cooperates effectively with others needed to help care for the child(ren).
5. The parent must cooperate with DHS by staying in touch with their ongoing Case Manager, letting the ongoing Case Manager know their address and telephone number, and allowing the ongoing Case Manager into their home to assess the home for safety.

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**Services to be provided by the DHS:**

1. DHS shall provide the services to target behavioral change identified in Condition 1.
2. DHS shall obtain reports from the parent's and children's treating therapists and service providers to monitor progress in meeting treatment objectives.
3. DHS shall provide bus tickets to the parents as needed to participate in services and visitation.
4. Other:
  - A.  DHS shall investigate the following relative placements:
  - B.  The Adoptions Unit is ordered to assess the viability of the current placement of the child(ren) Nevaeh Cheloff as a potential adoptive resource, and file a written report with the Court by the permanency plan review hearing date. A copy of the report shall also be provided to the GAL and the DA's Office.

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This portion of the Court's Order Applies to:

Father Tony Jones of Child, Nevaeh Chelaff

A. Special Findings of Fact:

- a. The parent, Tony Jones, is currently incarcerated at Dodge Correctional Institution.
  - i. His expected release date is December 2013.

B. DHS Responsibilities

In addition to any other responsibilities DHS has under this Order, DHS has the following special responsibilities towards the above-named incarcerated parents:

During any period of incarceration, the above-named parent services required to be provided by DHS for that parent shall be limited to services that are available within the correctional institution, and the agency primarily responsible for the provision of services ordered by the court shall do all of the following:

- 1) Contact the correctional institution in which the parent is currently incarcerated to learn about programs offered at the facility relating to this Order.
- 2) Write a letter to the parent advising them of programs available in the facility that would meet the requirements of this Order.
- 3) Maintain monthly written contact with the parent.
- 4) Advise the correctional institution of the services to be provided under the court order and, if the child is placed outside the home, of the conditions contained in the court order for the safe return of the child to the home.

C. Special Orders Regarding Visitation:

- a. Visitation is suspended until the parent establishes a relationship with the child, evidenced by written communication with the child at least once per month.
- b. After the parent establishes this relationship, visitation will not occur unless both DHS and the GAL agree that visitation is in the child's best interest.

D. Special Conditions of Return

- a. If the parent seeks reunification with their child, the parent must

- i. Inform DHS within 5 days of being transferred to any other correctional institution, half-way house, community placement, or release, whether that placement is within or outside of the Wisconsin Prison System.
  - ii. Participate in all programs recommended by the correctional institution's social worker.
  - iii. Authorize release of this order to the correctional institution's social worker.
  - iv. Maintain regular contact with DHS worker.
- b. If the parent seeks reunification with their child, the parent must maintain monthly contact with their children. Contact may be in the form of letters, cards, drawings, photographs, and other appropriate contact. The contact should be mailed to the DHS worker, who will forward it to the child, if appropriate.
- c. The parent, Tony Jones, has demonstrated a pattern of release and re-incarceration based on repeated criminal activity. This criminal activity makes the parent unavailable to the child to carry out the normal duties of parenting. Therefore, this parent must refrain from criminal activity during the period of this order, including activity that would cause them to be placed into custody and become unavailable to be parent to his child.
